Trax and More Trax

Since the last newsletter publication Rod Pye's Year 3/4 class completed a fascinating activity, whereby they had to work as a team to build a "trax-like" wheel and move it along the COLA area without it breaking.

The students had to co-operate to measure their lengths of paper to ensure it was the correct size for their team. They also had to construct strong joins to ensure that when the trax rotated with them guiding the rotation the paper would not disintegrate or rip. The key was definitely in the design and measurements needed to be accurate to make the ease of movement. It was wonderful to see student's engaged in working mathematically to solve this task.

Holiday First Aid

I had the wonderful opportunity to work with Years 5 and 6, to teach them some basic first aid in time for the holidays, as part of their PD/PE/Health unit of work.

Students had the opportunity to practice CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and bandaging. We talked about snake bites, bleeding, burns, choking, asthma, anaphylaxis and the importance of knowing the difference between a minor and a major first aid. We practised what to say if we had to report an incident to the emergency services. The students did a wonderful job performing given tasks and I was particularly impressed with their bandaging skills.



As holiday time rolls closer, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the P&C, parents and volunteers for supporting the school throughout the year. Successful education can only occur when open communication and support is evident.

With five weeks away from school I can't emphasise the importance of keeping your children reading. As the old saying goes *"The more you read, the more you know – the more you know, the more you grow."* So let's keep the children growing through the holidays.
