## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

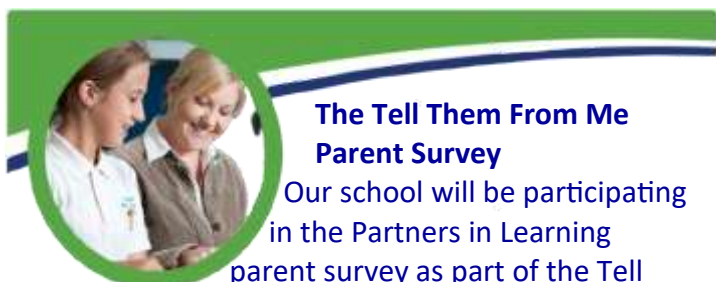
**COVID Update Bulahdelah Central School still remains on Level 3 restrictions.**

Masks/face coverings Under Level 3, Level 3 plus and Level 4 settings masks are required indoors for all staff and students in Year 7 and above. Masks are strongly recommended indoors for primary students. It is also mandatory for all staff and students in Year 7 and above to carry a mask with them at all times.

### Visitors

Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Parents should:

- maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside school gates
- remain outside school grounds
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign-in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school for pre-arranged meetings or visiting administration block.



### The Tell Them From Me Parent Survey

Our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey as part of the Tell

Them From Me suite of surveys on student engagement. The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationships between parents and school. The survey is designed to measure, assess and report insights from the parent's point of view at the school and system levels. The focus of this NSW survey is on student well being, engagement and effective teaching practices.

Survey responses are anonymous so staff in schools will not be able to identify individual parents or students from parent responses. Data suppression rules are applied to the school reporting tools where there are fewer than five responses. In other words, schools only see responses to questions which have been answered by five or more parents.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers.

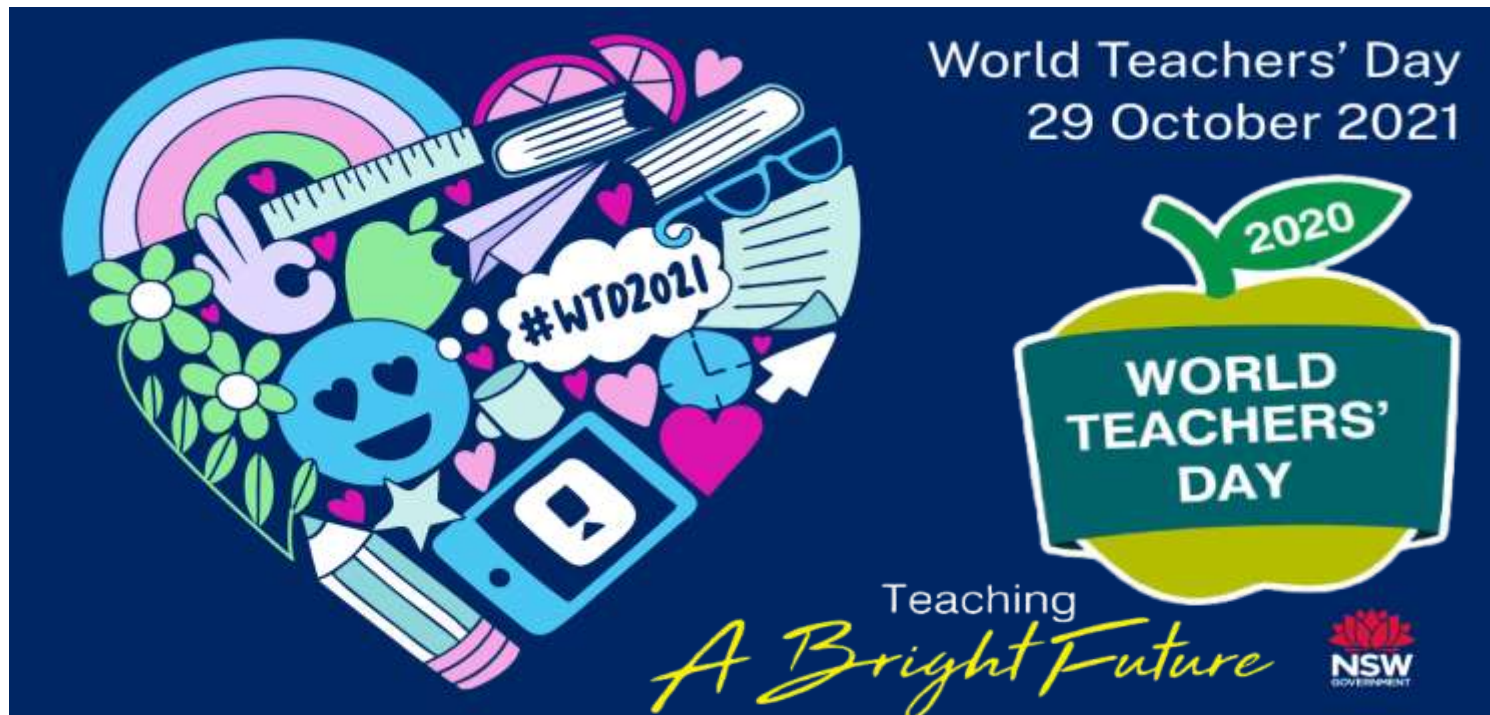

### Check-in assessment for Years 3 to 9

Dear parents and carers,

Year 3 to 9 students will participate in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment.

The check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor Year 3 to 9 student learning following the period of learning from home.

The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

- The assessment will be scheduled for our all students in Years 3 to 9 during Term 4 Weeks 3 to 5.

**These assessments will take place during normal timetabled classes during periods 1 to 4.**

**Students will be asked to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment. (NOT BLUETOOTH) Earbuds used for mobile phones or other portable devices may be suitable for use during the assessment. The type of computer connection needed is a jack or USB.**

If your child needs earbuds provided by the school, please contact Kim Rigley or Debbie Booth.

Students with disability will receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom, with their Support Teacher.
