- Hold a current WWCC (Working with Children Certificate),
- Not have a child or close relative (niece, first cousin etc.) sitting the HSC in NSW this year,
- Be able to lift examination boxes with exams, and
- Have a basic understanding of some computer programs.



A3 size or smaller (including frame) – any medium – ready to hang with wire/string securely attached.


Artworks on Canvas:

An A4 artwork framed in an A3 frame will allow for a border within the frame, however, if framing an A3 artwork in an A3 frame it will have NO border (see back of entry form for visual explanation).

High School artists (Ages 13, 14, 15, 16) may exhibit any artwork done at school no matter the size. Please ensure that your artwork is able to be hung with secure hooks and wire/string securely attached.
